Richard will instead focus on the gritty underbelly of the period, the Industrial Revolution, and the region that drove it forward.



'Invisible Visible', is an illuminating exploration of the experiences of individuals with disabilities in the workplace.


HERITAGE TRAIL | 10:00 - 15:00 | TOWN HALL
