13th-14th Bishop Auckland Food Festival

The Town Council is a major sponsor of the event which is organised by Durham County Council. The annual event which celebrates the very best of Northern food and drink features around 150 food, drinks and craft stalls, local food producers come together to showcase a fantastic range of culinary delights from some of the region's leading chefs and industry professionals.

May 2019

1st Youth Awards Presentation Evening

Bishop Auckland's fifth annual Youth Awards are an opportunity to acknowledge, celebrate and give recognition to young people in our town who have made significant progress in their own lives, achieved something significant or have made considerable contributions to others.

Nominees must be aged 20 or younger and live, study or work in Bishop Auckland, or their achievement or contribution is associated with the town. There are no specific categories for nominations. Awards are given on value of the achievements and contributions of young people rather than by category. Examples of previous nominees include young people who:

- Care for friends or family members
- Have carried out an act of bravery
- Help in their local community
- Have overcome their own difficulties
- Live with an illness
- Achieve great things in sport, dance and drama or at school

The Team of the Year Award recognises achievements made by a group of young people. We're not just looking for sporting success. A team can be a group of young people that have achieved something special or made a significant contribution to the town. The Team of the Year will win £500 to support their team's future endeavours.

September 2019

27th-28th Horticultural and Produce Show

Bishop Auckland's fifth Annual Horticulture and Produce Show never fails to deliver a wonderful display of locally grown flowers, produce, arts and crafts.

The Show will take place in the old McIntyre's store and Newgate Shopping Centre.

Organised by the Town Council with the help of local growers and in partnership with South Durham Enterprise Agency, Incredible Edible Bishop Auckland and Bishop Auckland and Coundon in Bloom, the Show offers over 40 classes for adults and children to get involved in. These range from classes for leeks, onions, chrysanthemum and dahlias for serious competition growers to wonky fruit and veg, designing a poster for next year's show and garden wildlife picture for the younger exhibitors. There is also a home produce category featuring jams, scones, pies, corsages and flower arrangements.

November 2019

10th Remembrance Sunday Service and Parade

Bishop Auckland Town Council in partnership with the Royal British Legion and 8th Battalion the Rifles, is organising a Remembrance Sunday Service and Parade to honour those who have sacrificed themselves to secure and protect our freedom.

The parade, which is being organised by the 8th Battalion the Rifles, will assemble at the Newgate Centre from 10.30am before marching to the War Memorial in the Market Place for the Act of Remembrance at 11.00am.

The Christmas Event will start in the Market Place at 4pm. The Full Moon Street Food market will be in attendance along with a stage and entertainment programme, children's rides and Santa's grotto.

December 2019
