Reminder:

Ensure you return your payment, signed tenancy agreement and self inspection to the Town Council promptly before 30 November. If your site has an association, you will also need to complete an Association Form - All included in your pack.

Ensure that you read the New Rules and Regulations in your pack - They apply to <u>every site</u>.

For Safety - No more than 2 gas bottles are permitted on a plot at one time and they must be safely stored.
