Food Festival Goes from Strength to Strength

Bishop Auckland Food Festival was held on for the first time over two days, Saturday 20th and Sunday 21st April 2013.

This was a great success with an estimated 15,000 people making the most of the sunny spring weather to visit the Festival. The numbers attending provided a major boost for local shops and businesses in the town.

Stalls offering produce from County Durham and further afield were located in Auckland Castle grounds, the Market Place and Newgate Centre. There were also numerous stalls offering art and crafts.



Included in the attractions on offer were demonstrations and talks by the Fabulous Baker Brothers, John Waite winner of the 'Great British Bake Off', Masterchief finalist Dean Edwards and Coronation Street star turned award winning cheese maker Sean Wilson.

The Town Council is a major sponsor of the Festival. It is hoped to build on this success in future years.

Allotments

The Town Council is responsible for 9 allotment sites within the Council's area. These are located at:-

- Broken Banks
- Edge Hill (A)
- The Pollards (A)
- South Church Lane
- Toronto
- West Mills
- West Mills Race
- Woodhouse Close (A)
- Tindale Crescent (A)

Sites marked ^(A) are run with the help of Allotment Associations. South Church Lane is fully self-managed.



Allotment sites are run on a self financing basis with income from rents being used to cover running costs such as water rates, occasional skip hire and maintenance of internal infrastructure. A capital scheme is carried out each year at one of the sites to make improvements or to resolve particular problems.

Work was carried out at The Pollards in March 2013 to resolve flooding issues and to improve the internal road. The invoice for the work was received after the year end accounts were completed and therefore the cost is not reflected in the financial summary on page 6.

Allotments provide an excellent opportunity for people to grow their own produce and at the same time get plenty of fresh air and exercise. Produce grown can contribute to a healthy balanced diet. It is also a social activity.

Allotments come in a variety of shapes and sizes and the size. The size of the plot will determine the amount of rent charged. The standard charge is 42p per square meter, but a 50% discount is applied if over half of the plot is cultivated and maintained.

PEST at its Best!

The Town Council's Parks and Environmental Support Team (PEST) carry our environmental support work in the town centre and recreation grounds to supplement the work carried out by Durham County Council.

The Team are contracted from Groundwork Trust and consist of a supervisor who works with apprentices and trainees to support them in accessing employment by providing work experience and helping them gain qualifications.

In 2012 the PEST team worked in partnership with the County Council to gain a Green Flag Award for the Town Recreation Grounds. The Team have continued to work with County Council colleagues to keep the park clean and tidy and well maintained.

The PEST team is again working towards the Green Flag status this year.

Diamond Jubilee

Royal Oak Saplings

Bus Station Toilets

The Town Council contributed £1,500 to the refurbishment of the County Council owned public toilets in Bishop Auckland Bus Station.

Hanging Baskets

The Town Council contributed £1,200 towards the provision of extra hanging baskets in Newgate Street.

Youth Awards 2012

The Town Council runs an annual Youth Awards competition aimed at helping new or established groups to fund projects that will enhance the experience, skills and creativity of young people aged between 5 and 20 within the town.

Three awards of up to £2,000 were available in 2012. Applications were received from 10 organisations.

The winners were:

Green Dragon Martial Arts

£1,975 was awarded to Green Dragon Martial Arts to run a project aimed at giving young people the knowledge, confidence and ability to recognise potentially threatening situations that presented a risk to them, their friends or family and to understand how to deal with these situations in a safe and confident way.

The project also sought to help young people that had experienced these types of situations as victims of crime, or encountered threatening behaviour. It would also help them deal with the emotional experience and help them understand and overcome fear.

Bishop Auckland Tennis Club

Bishop Auckland Tennis Club was awarded £955 to run a Tennis Programme to promote good health and

develop social skills through sport. The programme, aimed at young people aged 14 to 19, would raise aspirations and show how they can fulfil their potential.

The programme would also teach transferable skills that could be applied to other situations such as school work and employment.

Let's Get Cooking – King James 1 Community Association

King James 1 Community Association was awarded £1,400 for their 'Let's Get Cooking' programme, which aimed to help young people gain a qualification in food safety, gain confidence in catering and increase employment opportunities in the catering sector.

A book of recipes would also be produced to promote healthy eating among young people

Runner up prizes of £75 were presented to the 7 other entrants to support their projects.

The three winners will give presentations at this year's ceremony explaining how the funding helped their projects.

This year's ceremony will be held on Friday 7th June when the 2013 winners will be announced.

Music and Arts Festival 2012

29th June – 1st July 2012

Thousands of pop and opera fans braved the rain to enjoy a three day feast of entertainment at Bishop Auckland's Music and Arts Festival sponsored by the Town Council.

Despite torrential rain and flash floods more than 6,000 people went to see top name performers including X Factor winner Joe McElderry and former Squeeze, Mike + The Mechanics and Roxy Music vocalist Paul Carrack.

The Tyneside singer, who won ITV's X Factor in 2009 and Popstar to Opera Star 2011, made a guest appearance at Bishop Auckland College's Proms. The Proms concert, which ended the event, also included performances by the Hurworth Concert Band, St John's School Orchestra and the Cobweb orchestra with guest violinist Min-Jin Kym.



The Silence

Paul Carrack appeared on Saturday as part of a full line up from 12noon to 10pm. Pop rock five piece band 'The Silence', who had toured Europe and recorded in the US, headlined on the opening night, Friday.


