Thank you for your follow up email.

In the response to my FOI request (dated 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2025) regarding Question 10 which was:-  
What role did the Town Council play in the offer from the DCC to provide Auckland Project with a grant for the demolition and construction of a new hotel in the former market place area.

I would like to know who was the seat member representing Bishop Auckland Town Council (BATC) on the Stronger Towns Board regarding the decision to provide The Auckland Project (TAP) with the grant for the demolition and construction of the new hotel in the Bishop Auckland Market Place. What role did the BATC member play in the decision and did that person support or oppose the awarding of the grant to TAP.
